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# **IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION!**

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When using electrical appliances basic precautions should always be followed to reduce the risk of fire, electric shock and injury to persons, including the following:

- This heater is hot when in use. To avoid burning, do not touch hot surface. If provided, use handles when moving this heater. Keep combustible materials, such as furniture, pillows, bedding, papers, clothes, and curtains at least 1 m from the front of the heater and keep them away from the sides and rear. In order to avoid overheating, do not cover the heater.
- Extreme caution is necessary when any heater is used near children or the infirm and whenever the heater is left operating and unattended.
- Always unplug heater when not in use.

# Installation Overview


Your appliance facilitates three different installation configurations: **three-sided**, **two-sided**, **and single-sided**.





# Front Glass Installation / Removal

- Take off all screws from the top the glass panel. Fig.1-1
- Tilt the front glass forwards, and have two people to move out the glass panel. Fig.1-2
- Reverse these steps to re-install the front glass.








2. Take off the fending bars and panels if you want to view the fire from three sides. Fig.2-3



3. Fix back the fending bars after the panels are removed. Fig.2-4



4.Remove the screws from the fireplace as shown in the picture below. Fig.3-1



5.Fix the brackets with the screws in the previous step. Fig.3-2





6. Insert the fireplace into the wall opening. Drive the mounting screws into the brackets and the wall studs. Plug in and check if the fireplace works properly.Fig.3-3



7.Cover the glass panel with protective plastic bag and install plywood or drywall. Fig.3-4



8.Decorate the plywood or drywall with glazed tile,wallpaper, etc. Fig.3-5

# Wall Mounted Installation

# Due to the many different materials used on different walls, it is highly recommended that you consult your local builder before you install this appliance on the wall.


• Select a location that is not prone to moisture and is located at least 36" (914mm) away from combustible materials such as curtain drapes, furniture, bedding, paper, etc.

• Have two people hold the appliance against the wall to determine the final location.

• Place unit face down on a soft, non abrasive surface. Remove the bracket from the back of the unit by removing the two screws on sides.


• Mark out location, then mount the bracket onto the wall using the supplied screws. This bracket MUST have the hooks facing upward and be level.


NOTE: It is strongly recommended that the mounting bracket be screwed into the wall studs Where possible. If the wall Studs cannot be used, ensure that the supplied plastic anchors are used to affix the bracket to the wall and the bracket is adequately secured.



• With the wall mounting bracket installed have two people lift the appliance up and insert the two hooks on the bracket into the two slots on the back of the appliance. Secure it by fixing the two screws on sides.

• Check the appliance for stability ensuring that the bracket will not pull free from the wall.





# Log-set /Smoky Crystal /Vermiculite Installation

- **A.** Glass front must be removed and the appliance must be mounted in its final location before the fuel-bed media are installed.




Fig. 4-1 (FOR EFS1300)

- **B.** Plug the Lit Log-set to the power connectors and try to settle all connecting wires to be invisible from front. **Fig.4-1**
- **C.** Carefully place the smoky crystal and vermiculite fuels into the bottom tray around the log-set as illustrated. Apply an even layer from side to side. **Fig. 4-2**
- **D.** Re-install the front glass.


#### Power

Plug the power cord into a AC 220-240 Volt outlet (see **IMPORTANT SAFETY INFORMATION** on **Pages 2 and 3**). Make sure the outlet is in good condition and that the plug is not loose. **NEVER** exceed the maximum amperage for the circuit. **DO NOT** plug other appliances into the same circuit.

### **Methods of Operation**

This electric fireplace can be operated by the Manual CONTROL PANEL, or by the battery-powered REMOTE CONTROL.

If the temperature was previously set, those digits will be shown instead of "18".

- 4. When --:-- begins flashing, use 🗘 to select the desired hour and minutes to turn off the heater. Press **OK** to complete the setting. Press **X** at any time to clear the digits and shut down "OFF" timer.
- 5. Repeat steps 1 to 4 to set the "ON/OFF" time and temperature for Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday, Saturday, and Sunday.
- Press OK to complete programming, ensuring to aim the remote control at the receiver, located in the middle of the appliance. The appliance will "beep" once to confirm that programming has been successful.

#### Open window warning

If the room temperature decreases by 10 degrees within 3 minutes, the appliance will assume there is an open window nearby. In order to conserve energy, the heater will automatically switch from High Heat to Low Heat, or if the heater is already at Low Heat, it will turn off completely.

When switching from High Heat to Low Heat, the appliance will beep 3 times and the digital display will flash "88" 3 times before displaying the existing heating status.

When switching from Low Heat to Off, the appliance will beep 3 times and the digital display will flash "88"

continuously. To reset the heating function, see "operating remote control" section.

#### **Temperature Limiting Control**

This heater is equipped with a Temperature Limiting Control. Should the heater reach an unsafe temperature, the heater will automatically turn OFF. To reset:

- 1. Unplug the power cord from the outlet.
- 2. Turn the ON/OFF switch on the CONTROL PANEL to OFF. Wait 5 minutes.
- 3. Inspect the fireplace to make sure no vents are blocked, or clogged with dust or lint. If they are, use a vacuum to clean the vent areas.
- 4. With the POWER switch in the OFF position, plug the power cord back into the outlet.
- 5. If the problem continues, have your outlet and wiring inspected by a professional.

#### **Remote Control Battery Information**

Remote control uses two AAA batteries (NOT Included)



**NEVER** dispose of batteries in **fire.** Failure to observe this precaution **may result in an explosion**. Dispose of batteries at your local hazardous material processing center.

# **Care and Maintenance**

#### Cleaning



**ALWAYS** turn the heater **OFF** and **unplug the power cord from the outlet** before cleaning, performing maintenance, or moving this fireplace. Failure to do so could result in **electric shock, fire, or personal injury**.



**NEVER immerse in water** or **spray with water**. Doing so could result in **electric shock**, **fire, or personal injury**.

Metal:

- Buff using a soft cloth, slightly dampened with a citrus oil-based product.
- **DO NOT** use brass polish or household cleaners as these products will damage the metal trim. **Glass:** 
  - Use a good quality glass cleaner sprayed onto the cloth or towel. Dry thoroughly with a paper towel or lint-free cloth.
- **NEVER** use abrasive cleansers, liquid sprays, or any cleaner that could scratch the surface. **Vents:** 
  - Use a vacuum or duster to remove dust and dirt from the heater and vent areas.

#### Plastic:

- Wipe gently with a slightly damp cloth and a mild solution of dish soap and warm water.
- **NEVER** use abrasive cleansers, liquid sprays, or any cleaner that could scratch the surface.

#### Maintenance



Risk of electric shock! DO NOT OPEN any panels ! No user-serviceable parts inside!



**ALWAYS** turn the heater **OFF** and **unplug the power cord from the outlet** before cleaning, performing maintenance, or moving this fireplace. Failure to do so could result in **electric shock, fire, or personal injury**.

#### **Electrical and Moving Parts:**

- The fan motors are lubricated at the factory and will not require lubrication.
- Electrical components are integrated in the fireplace and are not serviceable by the consumer.

#### Storage:

Store heater in a clean dry place when not in use.



**WARNING! NO SERVICING** of the internal or electrical parts should be performed by the consumer. Do not service the unit yourself.



WEEE:

#### Meaning of crossed –out wheeled dustbin:
